As the Learning & Information Literacy Librarian, Grace Kaletski facilitates student information literacy learning at Stetson. She coordinates the library instruction program and teaches library instruction sessions, creates content for online learning, and is

always looking for new ways to support student acquisition of information literacy concepts and skills. She also provides individual research assistance to the Stetson community.

Kaletski's research interests center student and faculty relationships with information literacy, and critical information literacy pedagogy. Her current projects include a study of Stetson University faculty's perceptions of the knowledge practices outlined in the Framework for Information Literacy for Higher Education, and a long-term collaboration with the Director of the Writing Program in which they are investigating student acquisition of writing and information literacy skills.

Kaletski came to Stetson in 2015 after completing an M.S. in Library and Information Studies at Florida State University and an M.A. in Women's Studies at the University of Alabama. She is a member of the American Library Association and the Association of College & Research Libraries.
